



THE TOLL GATE starring WILLIAM S. HART

"The Toll Gate" is one of William S. Hart's films made early in 1920, produced by his own company under his personal supervision, and originally distributed theatrically by Paramount-Arteraft, although reissued later in the 1920's as a Sandee Picture. Many individuals consider "The Toll Gate" to be one of Hart's best films. Certainly its story thread is razor sharp—characterization surprisingly realistic and vivid—and the finished result today is an outstanding offerng for collectors.

To quote from the original press book: "William S. Hart is at the Theatre this week in one of the best pictures of his career. It is called 'The Toll Gate' and is a thrilling and unusually appealing story of the rugged days of the olden West.

"Mr. Hart appears as Black Deering, head of a bandit gang, but an honorable man beneath his rough exterior. Deering is anxious to abandon his life of pillaging, but Jordan, his chief lieutenant, urges him to one more hold-up. It is a frame-up and Deering is captured. But he manages to escape and performs several thrilling and hazardous feats in order to elude the sheriff's posse that is trailing him.

"Eventually Deering reaches safety in a clearing where the cabin of Mary Brown is located. She proves to be the deserted wife of Jordan. Under her influence, Deering resolves to do the right thing and gives himself up to the sheriff.

"Anna Q. Nilsson makes an appealing leading woman. Bill Hart's famous Pinto ony comes in for a good share of the attention and takes a notable part in many of the thrilling scenes.

Blackhawk's version is copied from a 35mm, print in the Gatewood Dunstan Collection in the Library of Congress supplemented by two sequences secured from individual collectors. While it is not absolutely complete, it is substantially so—definitely so in all essentials. 



















POSTAGE CHARGES

Blackhawk Films' prices do not include postage. Shipping weights are now given with each item and you can compute the approximate total weight and postage charges by referring to the postage table given below. While weights of a single shipment to virtually all post offices in continental United States are limited to 20 pounds, shipments to the states of Alaska and Hawaii may run as heavy as 70 pounds. These two states are in the eighth zone, and Blackhawk customers can approximate the correct postage to remit by figuring 18c per pound for each pound above twenty. The same formula applies to all U. S. Territories and Protectorates.

Some larger and heavier items, because of size and weight, are not mailable and will thus be shipped to you by express or freight, you paying the transportation charges on delivery. In general, shipments of size and weight requiring express or freight transportation will not be forwarded on a C.O.D. basis.

SALES TAX ON SHIPMENTS

Customers ordering films for shipment to points in the State of Iowa must also add 2% for the State Sales Tax.

Except where noted, Blackhawk will giadly make shipments of merchandise on a C.O.D. basis to any point in the United States. However, on C.O.D. shipments, the purchaser pays all transportation charges, in addition to the cost of the merchandise. None of the motion picture prints offered herela, either new or used, may be used for television or theatrical purposes, as these rights are specifically reserved. All new 16mm, and 8mm, short subject prints (except our Laurel and Hardy and other Hal Roach comedies) may be shipped by us to any destination in the world. Certain feature picture prints, both used and new, and a few short subjects on which used prints are available, are restricted as to the territories in which they may be used.

SHIPMENTS OUTSIDE

CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES
Shipments made to Hawaii, Alaska, Puerto Rico, Fleet Post Offices, Army Post Offices and other overseas locations move through the regular United States Postal System. We are glad to handle such shipments on exactly the same basis as shipments made within continental United States with the exception that no C.O.D.'s will be made outside continental United States.

Where shipments are made to countries other than the United States, payment may be made by letter of credit, by international money order or in any negotiable currency.

Where, on any type of payment, you wish to know the exact cost of your merchandise we will be glad to send a proforma invoice—and hold the wanted items—so that a precise amount may be determined. Where checks, money orders or other remittances are made in currencies other than those of the United States, we will immediately clear these funds through our bank. Your order will be suspended until our banks has notified us of the actual credit resulting from this clearance. This usually takes a matter of a week or ten days.

On shipments to overseas destinations other than those served directly by the United States Postal System, a surcharge of 10% is made to cover postage, insurance and the preparation of necessary customs forms.



WHAT'S THIS NUMBER "52805" IN BLACKHAWK'S ADDRESS!

Beginning July I, the Dayenport Post Office will begin operating under the new Postal Zip Code which, it is confidently expected, will greatly expedite the handling and sorting of mail, speed up service and ultimately begin to reduce the Post Office Department's soaring costs. This "Zip" number will adapt to automatic sorting as that modernized facility begins to spread throughout the postal system.

To satisfy the curiosity of those of you not presently in a Zip Code Area, here is what the numbers mean: The first digit identifies one of ten large areas into which the nation has been divided, the second digit identifies the state, the third digit the city (only the ten largest cities in any state are coded), and the fourth and fifth digits locate the delivery zone in the city. Thus, "5" indicates the major Zip Code area in which Davenport is located, "2" indicates Iowa, "8" indicates Davenport and "05" identifies our delivery zone in the city. The use of this number in addressing us will gradually mean more and more to you in getting expedited handling of everything you mail to us.
