JON NAKAMATSU, Artist in Residence July 21-30

Since his dramatic 1997 Van Cliburn Gold Medal triumph, Jon Nakamatsu's brilliant but unassuming musicianship and eclectic repertoire have made him a clear favorite throughout the world both on the concert circuit and in the recording studio. He has performed widely in North America, Europe, and the Far East and has collaborated with such conductors as James Conlon, Philippe Entremont, Marek Janowski, Raymond Leppard, Stanislaw Skrowaczewski, Michael Tilson Thomas and Osmo Vänskä. His extensive recital tours throughout the United States and Europe have featured appearances at Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center in New York City, at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., and in cities such as Boston, Chicago, Cincinnati, Paris, London, and Milan.



DOUGLAS HUMPHERYS July 25-27

Mr. Humpherys is currently the Artistic Director of the Gina Bachauer International Piano Competition, and has also adjudicated major piano competitions around the world. He has taught hundreds of master classes at international universities and conservatories. Mr. Humperys is Professor of Piano and Chair of the Piano Department at the Eastman School of Music.



DMITRI NOVGORODSKY July 25-26

At age of 16, Novgorodsky won the First Prize at the Kazakhstan's National Piano Competition, and later the Gold Medal of the National Festival of the Arts. Mr. Novgorodsky has appeared in Russia, Ukraine, Israel, France, Austria, Canada, Spain, Turkey, and Taiwan. In the United States, he has performed in such venues as Carnegie Hall and Steinway Hall (New York City), and the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. He joined the piano faculty of Ithaca College School of Music in 2015.
